When the Royal Commonwealth Society decided more than twenty years ago that they could no longer afford to house and maintain what was then one of the most comprehensive libraries of the history of the British Empire, the Librarian contacted a number of Specialist Philatelic Societies, the Malaya Study Group being one of them, and offered the near complete set of Government gazettes of the Straits Settlements and Malay States. A complex and difficult rescue campaign was put into operation involving many members of the Group under the then leadership of Andrew Norris. The Gazettes were rescued stored and eventually distributed to members of the Group who showed willingness to extract details and definitive information from the documents of Postal rates, Postal services, the Opening of Post Offices, items of historical interest and the development of the transport system by road, rail, sea and air.

The work, edited by Nigel Tyre and researched by a team including himself, John Chown, Rob Holley, Brian Reeder and Anthony Rogers over many years has now resulted in this magnificent cd. This work is a splendid example of group work of which we can all be proud and no member can afford to be without a copy of this ground breaking data bank.

The original documents have now been given back to the Cambridge University Library where they will be available for future generations to consult and study.
